### ENEL CHILE DELIVERS EQUIPMENT TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CHILE CLINICAL HOSPITAL TO SUPPORT THE FIGHT AGAINST CORONAVIRUS

- *The electric company's contribution consists of four intensive care monitors and 150,000 face masks for medical staff. The donation is made as part of the "Codo a Codo" campaign, carried out by Enel Chile along with the municipal governments and medical institutions for the purpose of providing healthcare supplies to different sectors.*

**Santiago, May 25, 2020.** With the goal of supporting the healthcare teams and patients being treated at the University of Chile Clinical Hospital, and to collaborate in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic, Enel Chile donated four intensive care monitors, two of which are multi-parameter and can measure heart rate, temperature, blood pressure and oxygen saturation, which is essential for intensive care unit beds. The other two monitors are for transport and will facilitate the transportation of patients while taking all the necessary precautions. Along with the monitors, Enel Chile provided 100,000 surgical face masks and 50,000 KN95 face masks for over 4,000 employees who work at the university hospital.
